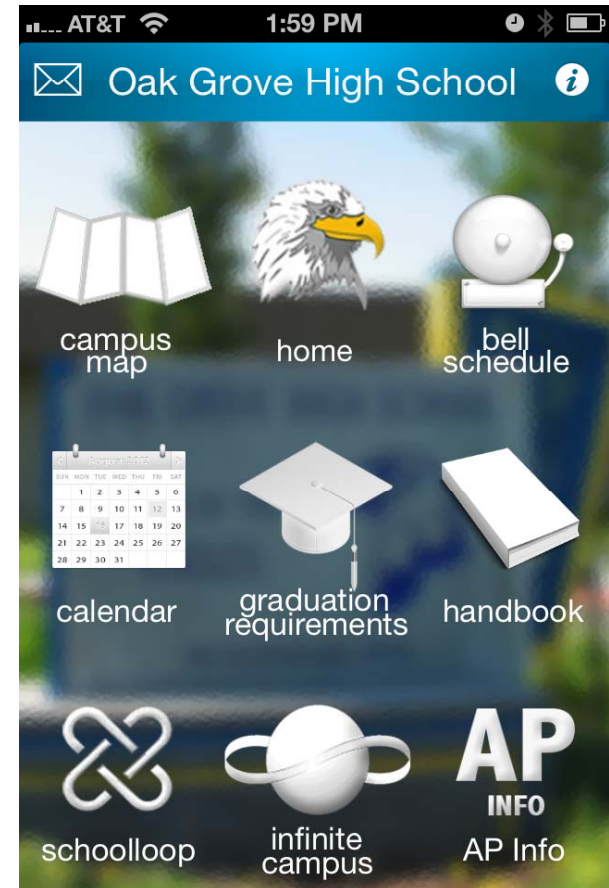


Intervention History

- The WASC Visiting Committee for Oak Grove HS recommended that teachers expand the use of Schoolloop to increase communication with parents; this after speaking with parents and learning that timely communication regarding their student(s) is an issue
- Similarly, the African American Student Advocates (AASA) Organization met with the ESUHSD Board of Trustees to discuss the communication problems experienced between teachers, parents and students throughout the district
- AASA requested that a pilot project, similar to the *Early Alert* system being used at Evergreen Community College, be implemented district-wide
- OGHS's School Goal #3: *Develop personalized intervention plans for student success*

Changes for 2012-13

- Hire additional mentors (from 1 to 4 teachers)
- Offer evening trainings for parents and students at *Back to School Night, Latino Parent Empowerment Meetings* and during extended counseling hours
- Include instructions (in English and Spanish) for creating an account with the mailing home of Marking Period 1 grades
- Send automated telephone calls home encouraging parents to register for Schoolloop
- Provide hard copies of Reach Out Reports for those parents who are not registered for SL and include instructions (in English and Spanish) for creating an account
- Offer teacher training during collaboration and afterschool at various ability levels
- Create specialized groups (SPED, coaches and club advisors)
- Advertise OGHS Application

Additional Intervention Strategies

Focus on Freshmen:

- Structured Freshmen Orientation to include session with APA (policies), Activities (Clubs and athletics), APED (college). We also included a session with Clarrisa Moore to discuss acceptance and tolerance.
- Expanded Opportunity class to “socially promoted” freshmen
- Globaloria (w/IS1 to hook them)
- FlexMath for Algebra 1 support

Data Talks (four times per year):

- Present data to 2nd period classes w/questions and lesson plans
- Questions related to connecting to school, classroom teaching strategies, credit recovery opportunities, A-G requirements, Post-Secondary Goals
- Overarching goals is to start conversations between parents, teachers and students
